Now, after all this experience and knoweldge, they release their new album, a tribute to free chants and work songs from both the north and the south and the strong connections that exist in the Iberian Peninsula, always looking for common points between the traditional Catalan songs and flamenco.

"ALÉ - Iberian Chants" (Segell Microscopi, 2025), the new album by Libérica revisits great standards of traditional Catalan and Valencian song such as El Rossinyol, Malaguenya de Barxeta, La Cançó del Lladre, Nana del Caballo Grande or La Tarara in the style of flamenco jazz, mixing his lyrics with flamenco traditional songs that talk about the same themes but with different words. The voices of the Catalan singers Pere Martínez, the Valencian Carles Dénia, the Andalusian Antonio Lizana and the Catalan singer Alba Careta, represent these coexisting worlds in the Peninsula that are found in Libérica in an organic and free way thanks to jazz. In the rythm section we find pianist Max Villavecchia, drummers Raphael Pannier and Oriol Roca, and Manel Fortià himself on double bass and arrangements who steers the ship from the rear. A musical journey where we travel from north to south through their songs and always at the service of music.
